## BPD educates on dangers of opioids

Oliver Middle School Health teachers, Jan Johnson and Bryon Rockow, invited Investigator Tyler Dawson and Officers John Vadas and Camille Harrison with the Brockport Police Department to educate our eighth-grade students on the dangers of opioids. Opioid misuse and addiction have been an ongoing crisis that leads to nearly 50,000 deaths per year in the U.S.

Their presentation included:

- The evolution of how people become addicted to opioids
- The effects opioids have on the human body and how they interact with the body
- Interdiction and the goal of law enforcement to slow the narcotics distribution network/dangers of illicit street drugs
- Local cases involving DRE arrests, interdiction and explanation of laws
- Support information and resources geared toward opioids, including a video on Narcan

# INSTRUCTIONAL HIGHLIGHTS

## Summer math and literacy program

Brockport CSD is excited to announce its summer math and literacy program. Students in grades K – 6 receiving Academic Intervention Services may be eligible to attend. Our summer program will focus on targeting students' skill areas, bridging learning gaps and setting students up for success as we enter the 2022-23 school year.



The instructional program will run Monday through Thursday, July 18 - August 11, 2022, from 8 a.m. – 12 p.m. at Hill Elementary School. Transportation and snacks will be provided.

Reading and writing centers will focus on word study, foundational skills and targeted instruction. Math centers will focus on number sense, fact fluency and flexible thinking through the use of games, number talks and hands-on manipulatives.

Kelly Keenan and Andrew Guignon will serve as the program's principal and assistant principal, respectively. The administrative team has started planning for the summer session and working with teachers and administrators to identify students to participate. Additional information will be sent home mid-May to those selected.

## Equity and Inclusion

Brockport High School students were asked to create posters that highlight the contributions of people of color and women for Black History and Women's History month. The posters were designed by students from the Diversity Club and can be found hanging year-round in the high school near the department, or area of focus, most closely associated with the individual highlighted. The goal is to have the posters eventually work their way down to the middle and elementary buildings for younger students to learn and enjoy.

BHS students also read age and developmentally appropriate books to our elementary students, highlighting the contributions of people of color and women to American history.

In addition, our Diversity Club members will soon begin work to develop a professional development session that discusses teaching and learning in a diverse environment. The students are currently taking an online course through Cornell University. Once they have completed the course, they will share this information with our school community.

Welcome to Brockport's Continuing Education program! The mission of our program is to offer continued learning opportunities that meet the needs and interests of our community.


The Brockport Continuing Education program is a self-sustaining program funded by enrollment fees. Since we rely solely on course fees, it is necessary to maintain minimum registration requirements. Please know that classes not meeting minimum registration requirements may be canceled. Notifications for class cancellations due to limited registration will be made prior to first class sessions and refunds will be issued. Please know that class registration fees do not include the cost of books, materials or supplies, unless noted in class descriptions.

**All checks must be made payable to: Brockport Continuing Education. Our office must receive all forms one week prior to the first class session date.** Please remember that prompt registration may reduce the likelihood of classes being canceled due to low enrollment. You must be 18 years of age or older to be eligible to register, with the exception of those courses designed specifically for young students.

## Refunds

Refunds are provided only if a student withdraws from the class 24 hours prior to the scheduled start date. No refunds will be provided after the first class. If you join a class after the scheduled start date, the tuition will be the same amount. If a class needs to be canceled due to maintenance or weather emergencies, no partial refund will be issued. **Refunds will be processed for courses that have been fully canceled from our schedule for reasons such as low enrollment.** Fees for registration do not include the cost of books, materials or supplies, unless noted.

## Class cancellation & confirmation

Individual canceled classes will be rescheduled whenever possible. No refunds will be issued for classes that are not able to be rescheduled. No Continuing Education classes are held when Brockport schools are closed due to weather cancellations or emergency conditions. No confirmations are sent.**

Enrolled students will receive instruction in the classroom, behind the wheel and on the road, as required by New York State Department of Motor Vehicles. Those successfully completing the class will receive an MV285 certificate that gives the holder the privilege to receive a Class D operator's license when reaching age 17, allowing them to drive after 9 p.m. Students must be 16 years old by July 5, 2022, and hold a valid NYS Driver Permit or License to be eligible for the course. The Pre-Licensing Five-Hour Course material is included in Driver Education.

Most insurance companies will offer a discount on compulsory car insurance upon request.

**Instructors:** Dana Mallaber- Cohort I, Richard Barrett - Cohort II

**Classroom Instruction:** ALL students must attend ALL 16 sessions of classroom instruction in the Brockport High School Room 192. The loan of a textbook is included in the class fee.

**Please note: Student must be present for the first theory class to be allowed entry into the course. Please arrive 15 minutes prior to the start of the first class. (Late arrivals will not be admitted and, if registered, will forfeit course enrollment). No early dismissals from theory class are allowed.**

*NY State mandates that students must attend 16 classroom sessions (theory classes) and 16 driving sessions. This is a commitment. Therefore, if you miss a class or driving session, you may have to wait until the fall session in September to make it up, and then you will be able to receive your certificate of completion for the course.*

## Students must have the following:

- Permit/license
- NYS Driver Manual
- Notebook/folder
- Writing materials
- Sunglasses are encouraged
- Appropriate footwear (i.e. no backless sandals)

**Driving groups:** Will start and end at the Brockport High School pool door (east side) parking lot. ALL students must attend ALL classroom and road classes to receive the MV285 certificate. Should a make-up driving class be requested by a student due to extenuating circumstances, they will be scheduled at the discretion of the instructor. Scheduling of, or transportation to, the road test are not included. Parents or other qualified adults should plan to devote time for enrolled students to practice the skills learned in this class. Only experience and good judgment will make a safe driver. A current NYS Learner's Permit must be brought to all classes.

**Registration directions:** Send your payment, completed registration form and a copy of the student's learner's permit / license to the address listed on the registration form. **The cost is \$470 for district residents, \$490 for non-residents.** The registration process will end on Wednesday, June 22, 2022. **Please select your drive groups, listing your choices in order of preference. First priority will be given to resident seniors, then resident juniors, then underclassmen and non-residents. Every effort will be made to accommodate your request.** You will be notified by email or telephone if you have been accepted and enrolled. If a registrant did not get one of the summer sessions, they will be notified in writing and placed on a priority list for the next session.
